Today is the 4th Sunday in the Season of Easter. We are well on our way in the "Great Fifty Days." Our worship continues a post-Easter experience of life and faith in the new church.

The Time of Preparation

is provided for us to settle ourselves and offer a silent prayer before worship begins. This morning we'll be doing a little bit of 'worship preparation.'

Our Service begins with a **WELCOME** to all who are gathered to worship together. We embrace the opportunity to share the good news of what we are doing outside of the sanctuary which is also our 'worship' and our 'service' to God. Our **"Call to Worship"** leads into our first corporate prayer as the gathered body of Christ. The 'Gathering Prayer' reflects the themes of the day's worship.

Today we're adding a 'musical element' to the Call to Worship. Don't worry – we'll practice.

Our Opening Hymn, "Good Shepherd We Are Not Alone" is written for the day. The tune is from a familiar Easter Hymn.

Our final 'gathering act' we "Pass the Peace" as an act of caring, welcome, and mutual love. In any language, the love of God is translated into peace as we join hands and hearts together. We are re-gathered as a worshipping community with a verse from the Hymn "God Is Here"

**Corporate
Confession:**

In the Presbyterian and Reformed Tradition, we do not offer individual confession save for that which we offer in our silent prayers. Our prayer today reminds us that we are not simply individuals but citizens of the world seeking the kingdom of God. Our prayer and the "Assurance of Forgiveness" echo themes present in our Epistle lesson for the day.

Today's Offertory Anthem reflects the Psalm and theme for the day. Based on the 23rd Psalm we sing the classic anthem, "The King of Love My Shepherd Is."

(On Communion Sundays, we invite the young church to remain with us. There is a nursery for the youngest of us.)

Seek God in the peace of this place, and bring to God what you carry, and all that burdens you. Let us pray:

Patient and loving God, we stand at the gate and peer through. We keep creating our own ways, believing that we know what is in our own best interest, and we ignore the voice of the one Shepherd who will guide us to peace and hope. We wander aimlessly and then wonder why we get so lost. Help us stop and listen to the Shepherd's voice. Let us place our trust in the Shepherd who has never failed us, who loves and guides our lives. Forgive us our stubbornness and stupidity. For we ask this in Christ's Name. AMEN.

INVITATION TO THE TABLE

THE GREAT PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

May the God of every way be with you.

And also with you.

Lift your hearts to the One who is the Truth for God's own people.

We offer them to the One who warms them with love.

Sing praises to God, who is our Life.

Glad songs are offered to the One who provides shelter for us.

You made a way through chaos, Constructing God, the Word echoing on mountaintops and whispering in valleys; the Spirit teaching songs to the stars, and breathing life into those created in your image as your precious children. You longed to cradle us in your lap, feeding us with grace and hope, but we slipped out of your grasp, covering our ears as you called us to come back home to you.

Prophets came to remind us that you would not put us to shame, psalmists sang to us of your longing to cut the net of sin and death and set us free, but, together, we rushed into the open arms of temptation. Then you sent Jesus, so that in knowing and believing in him, we would know and believe in you. With those who have nothing and with those who give everything away, we lift our voices to you:

(No. 581 Sung) **Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might,**

heaven and earth are full of Your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

**Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest;
Hosanna in the highest.”**

You shape a safe place for us, Imaginative God, and send your Child, Jesus, to show us the Way. Born a tiny baby as we are, he shows us how to grow into your people. The cornerstone of your kingdom, he uses us to build a spiritual home for all. Committing his spirit to you, he entered the emptiness of death, so we might stand on the solid ground of the resurrected life.

The ‘heart’ of our worship is “The Proclamation of God’s Word.”

(We use the ‘common lectionary’ which is a guide that assigns readings over a three-year cycle. God’s people are given the opportunity to hear and read along God’s Word from the Bible).

We stand for the reading of the gospel in a very old tradition of the church. In response to the Word read there is the ‘preaching of the word for our living today.’ This includes words for ‘the young church’ and all who gather.

The remainder of the service is “**Sharing Our Response to God**” which is our opportunity to respond to the Word read, preached and heard. Which today also includes our gathering at the Table for the Sacrament of the Lord’s Supper.

On the first Sunday of each month we are invited to gather at the table for the Sacrament of the Lord’s Supper.

“The Great Prayer of Thanksgiving” is shared from the table and acts as a ‘blessing’ or ‘grace’ as we gather.

The Words of Institution are a scriptural evidence of the sharing of the Lord's Supper in the very early church. "Instituted" means in this case to be established as the norm for future use. These words with some variation have been used throughout the history of the church to bring the present-day table into the context of Jesus' last supper with his disciples.

We are a 'communal' fellowship of believers, therefore we will receive and hold the elements and 'commune' (eat and then drink) together. As we wait, we will be offered concerns for our silent prayers. Please note the worship notes in the bulletin.

We share our "Prayer of Dedication" as we acknowledge the presence of Christ in the meal and the spiritual nourishment offered us in the sacrament.

As we 'go into the world' we are charged and blessed with words of encouragement to take with us into our week ahead.

The 'Benediction' offers the final 'good words' said over God's people as they continue to worship in their living day by day.

After worship we invite you to our time of Fellowship in the Dining Hall. Join us!

Even as we celebrate the Life which was his, as we claim the Truth, that all are one with you, we take refuge in that mystery called faith:

No. 582, Sung) "Dying, you destroyed our death; Rising, You restored our life. Lord Jesus, come in glory."

Once, we were nobodies, alone and hopeless, but by your mercy, Living God, we are now a family, gathered in your love around this Table, where the Spirit sanctifies the bread and cup. You lean over to serve us the bread, enveloping us in your grace so we might go to be your people. You offer to us the cup of hope, which can heal our troubled hearts and strengthen us to serve our world. And when the Way leads us home to you, when your Life gathers us with our sisters and brothers around the Table which is prepared by your Truth, we will sing glad songs of praise to you forever,

(No. 584, Sung) **"Amen, Amen."**

SHARING OF THE MEAL

[As you remain in your seats, Elders will bring the elements to you. It is our tradition to receive the bread and say as you pass it, "The body of Christ, given for you." And likewise, as you receive and pass the cup say, "The blood of Christ, shed for you." We invite you to hold the elements, bread and then the cup. We commune together as the Pastor says, "Take and Eat..." and "Take and drink...". (In the tray the inner circles are wine and the outer circles are grape juice.)
