And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."." (Mark 1:9-11)

Today we celebrate Baptism of the Lord Sunday which is in the 1st Sunday in the season of Epiphany. We will also we renewing our Baptism and sharing the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

Music as we prepare for worship is "Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing" arranged and performed in an Appalachian Folk Style by Mark Baldwin.

Our Service begins with a **WELCOME** to all who are gathered to worship together.

We share news of our life together as a church in our service because what we do, outside of worship, is a very vital portion of our 'service to God.'

The psalmist tells us that the One whose voice can knock trees to the ground listens to our hesitant prayers which speak of our sin, of how we have hurt others, as well as God. Join me, as we pray to the One who will bless us with peace and forgiveness:

You would have all people hear of your grace, Servant God, but we hinder your efforts by hoarding your Word for ourselves.

You would have hope flow through our neighborhoods,

but we thwart your plans by damming it up in our hearts. You would have us skip into your kingdom,

but we frustrate your future by clinging so tightly to those grudges we have carried for so long.

Have mercy on us, Shaker of our wildernesses, and unlock the shuttered doors of our hearts.

You know the good news God has proclaimed to you: we are called to let go of the past, and to walk, hand in hand with the Spirit, into the kingdom.

God forgives us, accepts us, and sends us forth to do good, and to testify about the One who baptizes us in the water and the Spirit. Thanks be to God. Amen.

In our final 'gathering act' we "Pass the Peace" as an act of caring, welcome, and mutual love. Please remain standing as we sing "Blest Be The Tie That Binds."

We practice Corporate Confession in the Presbyterian and Reformed Tradition. We do not offer individual confession save for that which we offer in our silent prayers. We believe that we are a community of faith and as such share in the sins of all. We are "Called to Confession" as a reminder of our individual and communal sin. Our "Confession and Pardon" gives expression to our desire to know forgiveness. The "Kyrie Eleison" is a choral bridge between our prayers and the "Assurance of Forgiveness" which declares our forgiveness. Finally, we give praise to our triune God for the assurance that we are, by grace, forgiven.

Having Confessed our sin and realized God's forgiveness the church gathered is prepared to hear the Word of God read and proclaimed.

"The Proclamation of God's Word" is central in the life of the worshiping community.

(We use the 'common lectionary' which is a guide the assigns readings over a three-year cycle. God's people are given the opportunity to hear and read along in God's Word from the Bible).

In response to the Word read there is the 'preaching of the word for our living today.' This includes words for 'the young church' and all who gather.

On this "Baptism of the Lord" Sunday we will share an "Invitation to a service of Belonging, Baptismal Remembrance & The Lord's Supper And Calling."

We claim God's claim on us in calling us by name. We respond to God's claim in how we live and in what we do. We will be invited to give our offerings, to come to the font and touch the water and 'remember our baptism' as an occasion of the verbalization an realization' of God's call and claim upon our living and then to 'come to table'

We share our "Great Prayer of Thanksgiving" today as we come to the font and the table. In our lives as Christians we experience two sacraments and on this day we celebrate the renewal of Baptism and the blessing of The Lord's Supper.

Ushers will be collecting the morning offering and as soon as they have passed your pew you are invited to come forward to "touch the waters and renew your baptism" and then proceed to the left or right to receive the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper. If you prefer not to come forward the elements will be brought to you.

The choir will sing an Offertory Anthem as we are coming forward called "This Baptizing Day" which has a familiar tune with words that mark the day of Jesus' baptism and the renewal of our own.

After the anthem we will remain seated (until our time to come forward) and sing the "Hymns As We Come To Font and Table." (We will sing the final verse of "Let Us Talents..." for our response today.

As we share our Prayer of Dedication and Commitment we remember all of our congregation and others who we lift before God in prayer. Please be in prayer this week for those who are listed on the last page of the bulletin.

Renewed and nourished we will go into the world in this new year with greater commitment and dedication to the call of Christ to serve with our whole beings.
