Our Hymn of Praise is one of the classic hymns in the Christian tradition, “I Sing The Mighty Power of God.” Isaac Watts (1674-1748), first published this hymn in his hymnal for children: “Divine Songs Attempted in Easy Language, for the Use of Children (1715)” which was one of the most popular collections published in its day. Poems from this hymnal were used to inculcate many English children in Watts’ day and for decades after his death. In his preface, “To all that are concerned in the education of children,” Watts cites a biblical precedent for teaching songs to children for educational value: “The children of Israel were commanded to learn the words of the song of Moses, and we are directed in the New Testament, not only to sing ‘with grace in the heart, but to teach and admonish one another by hymns and songs.’

In our final ‘gathering act’ we **“Pass the Peace”** as an act of caring, welcome, and mutual love.

Corporate Confession:
In the Presbyterian and Reformed Tradition, we do not offer individual confession save for that which we offer in our silent prayers. Our prayer and the **“Assurance of Forgiveness”** echo themes for the day.

“The Proclamation of God’s Word” is central in the life of the worshipping community. This ‘proclamation’ includes the reading of scripture, the sharing of an anthem or musical expression of the day’s theme, the Time with The Young Church and the preaching of the Word.

Today’s anthem is based on the great hymn “Blessed Assurance” in an arrangement by John Ness Beck.

As part of our Time With the Young Church we will welcome new members and share in the Sacrament of Baptism.

What follows the preaching of the Word is our response to that Word. We respond here in song, affirmation, giving, and sharing of life. We take with us as we go our response to God in our service in the world.

As we respond to God’s Word preached, we sing together the timeless song for children of all ages, “Jesus Loves Me.”

May we lift our voices in a strong and unified advocacy so that governments will act now to save lives and to protect the peoples displaced by conflict, poverty, and evil.

Jesus, who said, "*let the children come to me,*" receive our sorrow and the gift of our broken spirits, for we have so much yet to do to welcome even a few of *the least of these* to save your broken children, to strengthen and support their communities to call the world to accountability, to generosity, and to peace. Help us find courage, compassion and hope, for we need your grace. Help us to welcome Christ.

IN SHARING LIFE IN THE CHURCH AND OUR TITHES AND OFFERINGS

***DOXOLOGY AND PRAYER OF DEDICATION**

In the Presbyterian and Reformed tradition, we share an "Affirmation of Faith" as an expression of our faith and belief in response to hearing the Word. Today we use the 'ecumenical' version of the ancient Apostles' Creed.

In our prayers we ask for God's presence with and intervention for those we list each week on the back of the bulletin. We have many who are in ongoing situations of treatment, others who are saddened by loss, and still others who face uncertain futures. We keep these in our prayers today and every day.

We're trying a new twist in our worship order today. As we give our offerings we will also share what we are 'offering' God this week in the life of the church.

We share our Tithes and Offerings as an active response to God's blessings to us in our living. What we give supports the work and worship of the church including all of our programs, our mission efforts and our sharing of mutual love and affection for one another.

A "Charge and Blessing" is the parallel element of worship for the "Call to Worship" which begins the service. The charge is for us to take what we have gained in worship into the world as an active service to God. The blessing is a word to us to remember that God goes with us when we go.

Our Hymn of Parting is a church classic, "Lord Speak To Me That I May Speak."

The 'Benediction' offers the final 'good words' said over God's people as they continue to worship in their living day by day.

***CHARGE AND BLESSING**

Jesus promises: To all who have accepted my call,
I give peace, joy, love, courage, strength, wisdom.

Jesus will walk with us and be with us always.

Jesus promises: When you feel that you are faltering, I will lift you;
