## WELCOME TO COMMUNION SUNDAY!

God's people will be gathered today at the table of peace and grace. **Hallelujah!** 

Out there in the world today it is "Super Bowl Sunday" and in here we remember that it is also "Souper Bowl Sunday" as we share that special offering at the close of worship.

The Time of Preparation is provided for us to settle ourselves and offer a silent prayer before worship begins. Let us pray for PEACE. Our music, the 'alive' sound of the song 'You Are The Light of the World' from the musical "Godspell."

Our Service begins with a **WELCOME** to all who are gathered to worship together. We embrace the opportunity to share the good news of what we are doing outside of the sanctuary which is also our 'worship' and our 'service' to God.

Our "Call to Worship" leads into our first corporate prayer as the gathered body of Christ. The 'Gathering Prayer' reflects the themes of the day's worship. We are called to be the 'light of the world and the salt of the earth.'

Our first Hymn, "O Splendor of God's Glory Bright," is one of the oldest hymns of the church. Written by St. Ambrose (340-397), this hymn, "Splendor Paternae Gloriae" in Latin, is a beautiful morning hymn asking for help and guidance throughout the day. It is directed to the Trinity, and especially to Christ as the light of the world. It reminds us that Jesus, The Light of the World, invites us to be the same for others.

You proclaim the mysteries of grace, Voice of Fulfillment, not with fancy words but in weakness which gives strength to the weary; in compassion, which offers the guest room of your heart to the homeless; in love, as you take off your coat, and place it around the shoulders of a shivering child.

You speak softly, Revealer of Wonders, using the alphabet blocks of grace and hope, so all can know the hidden heart of God; so all may know the words to proclaim the Light who has come into the world.

Hear us as we pray as faithful children, Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory, forever. Amen."

#### \*CONFESSION AND PARDON (Unison)

It is so simple - make a sandwich for the hungry, open our ears to the crying child, and change unjust laws. As salt and light we are called to worship God in our service. Let us confess how we have not answered this call, as we pray saying,

We admit, Holy One, how in superstition, we will throw salt over our shoulders, but find it hard to flavor a world made bland by the ordinary. We dim our gifts to save our energy, instead of shining as long as we can in society's shadowed corners. We skip a meal once a week to show our faith, but are unable to see those who go through the dumpster to feed their children.

Forgive us, and have mercy, Creation's Goodness. By your grace, heal our brokenness, so we might fix the shattered dreams of our world. With your hope, strengthen our hearts, so we might fill the emptiness of our society. This we ask in the wonderful name of the world's true light, Jesus Christ, Amen.

"Lord, have mercy upon us, Christ have mercy upon us, Lord have mercy upon us."

#### \*ASSURANCE OF PARDON

God has heard our prayers and comes to us to sweeten our bitterness with hope - to shatter our darkness with the light of mercy.

We will share this good news without being ordered to do so. We will praise God's name because we want to! Thanks be to God. Amen.

#### **OLD TESTAMENT LESSON**

Isaiah 58:1-9a (OT: p. 688)

#### **NEW TESTAMENT LESSONS**

1 Corinthians 2:1-12 (NT: p. 166) \* Matthew 5:13-20 (NT: p. 4) In our final 'gathering act' we "Pass the Peace" as an act of caring, welcome, and mutual love. In any language, the love of God is translated into peace as we join hands and hearts together. We are re-gathered as a worshiping community with a verse from the Hymn "Blest Be The Tie That Binds."

### Corporate Confession:

In the Presbyterian and Reformed Tradition, we do not offer individual confession save for that which we offer in our silent prayers. Our prayer today reminds us that we are not simply individuals but citizens of the world seeking the kingdom of God. Our prayer and the "Assurance of Forgiveness" echo themes present in our Epistle lesson for the day.

The 'heart' of our worship is "The Proclamation of God's Word."

(We use the 'common lectionary' which is a guide that assigns readings over a three-year cycle. God's people are given the opportunity to hear and read along God's Word from the Bible). We stand for the reading of the gospel in a very old tradition of the church. In response to the Word read there is the 'preaching of the word for our living today.' This includes words for 'the young church' and all who aather.

(On Communion Sundays we invite the young church to remain with us. There is a nursery for the youngest of us.)

The remainder of the service is "Sharing Our Response to God" which is our opportunity to respond to the Word read, preached and heard. Which today also includes our gathering at the Table for the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

Today's Offertory Anthem is the lively "Walk In the Light" by Andre Thomas. It calls on us to embrace our call to be the 'light of the world."

On the first Sunday of each month we are invited to gather at the table for the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper. Today we do so in great hopes for peace that comes in the communion of God's people here and around the world. As we receive the elements today we remember that others, both different and the same. are gathered today in the breaking of the bread and sharing of the cup.

#### THE SACRAMENT OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

#### INVITATION TO THE TABLE

(The Lord's table is open to all who confess faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.)

Jesus Christ stands preaching today from the mountain side and calls us to follow.

#### We have heard his calling in our lives.

Along the way he pauses with us here, at the table of grace, so that we might be fed.

We gather, forgiven in the blessing of his presence in our midst

Come and eat! Come and drink! The master calls us to be nourished so that we can call others.

We embrace the call and gather at the table.

#### THE GREAT PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

May the Lord of the Feast be with you!

And also with you!

You are God's salt here on earth.

We offer our hearts to God, so they may be spiced with mercy, justice, and love.

You are God's light in this time.

# We show the world the brokenness in its midst, so that all creation might be healed!

You would not let emptiness remain constant, God of wisdom and wonder, but brought forth creation, flavoring the seas with your salty tears, lightening the shadows of chaos so the universe could find the way as it unfolded from your imagination. You shaped us in your image hoping that, in faith, we would fast with you on justice, peace, reconciliation, and joy. But when sin laid out its feast we ran, pushing and shoving to the table, to gorge ourselves on tempting entrees, to be stuffed by deadening desserts. Prophets came, reminding us of our stubbornness, but we only practiced righteousness, never getting past the first act. So, you sent Jesus to us, to show us the fast you choose.

So, we join our voices with those who call out to you in every age, singing of your hopes for us:

(No. 581 Sung)" Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of Your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest; Hosanna in the highest."

You are the holiness of our lives, Loving God, and Jesus Christ is your Light for all. The bright morning star of creation, he would not remain hidden, but came to light the way for us. The one who hung the stars in the heavens, he comes to loosen the knots tied tightly around the hearts of the oppressed. The one who received every gift from you, empties the closets filled with grace and hope, sharing them with sisters and brothers everywhere. The one who holds us in his heart, opens his hands in surrender on the cross, so that death's clenched fist will release us, so our healing will spring up to embrace us. We remember how his light shone on all, as we celebrate his spirit which enhances our lives, we speak of that mystery of faith:

(No. 582, Sung) "Dying, You destroyed our death; Rising, You restored our life. Lord Jesus, come in glory."

Pour out your Spirit upon the gifts of the bread and the cup, prepared for those who love you. As we unclench our fists to receive your brokenness, we would open our hearts in love to those burdened by hopelessness, we would feed all who hunger. As we are welcomed at your Table, and nourished by the cup of life, we would add a room onto our homes, to shelter a homeless family, we would share from our abundance to rebuild the shattered lives of the poor.

And when the yoke of time has been removed, and we gather at the feast prepared for us in glory, our songs of thanksgiving will be like springs of water, which will flow for all eternity into your heart,

(No. 584, Sung) "Amen, Amen."

"The Great Prayer of Thanksgiving" is shared from the table and acts as a 'blessing' or 'grace' as we gather. This prayer recounts God's gracious creative power, our sinfulness and Christ's coming to redeem us and make us whole.

The 'table' is not an altar for sacrifice, but a table upon which are symbols of Christ's body and blood given freely for us. We believe that Christ is the 'lamb of God' sacrificed for us once and for all on the cross.

The Words of Institution are scriptural evidence of the sharing of the Lord's Supper in the very early church. "Instituted" means in this case to be established as the norm for future use. These words, with some variation, have been used throughout the history of the church to bring the present-day table into the context of Jesus' last supper with his disciples.

We are a 'communal' fellowship of believers, therefore we will receive and hold the elements and 'commune' (eat and then drink) together. As we wait, we will be offered concerns for our silent prayers.

We share our "Prayer of Dedication" as we acknowledge the presence of Christ in the meal and the spiritual nourishment offered us in the sacrament.

As we 'go into the world' we are charged and blessed with words of encouragement to take with us into our week ahead.

The 'Benediction' offers the final 'good words' said over God's people as they continue to worship in their living day by day.

After worship we invite your participation in the "Souper Bowl Offering" and then our time of Fellowship in the Dining Hall. Join us!

#### SHARING OF THE MEAL

(Elders will bring the elements and it is our tradition to receive them, hold them, and commune together.)

#### PRAYER OF DEDICATION (unison)

"Loving God, source of all blessing, we give you thanks for inviting us to share this meal as your family. Strengthen us to be a blessing to one another and a blessing to all the world, glorifying you in all things, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen."

#### \*CHARGE AND BLESSING

We are the salt of the earth.

#### We are the light of the world.

Go from here making more savory the world around you; bringing the light of Christ in you to dispel darkness; and give all the glory to God!

We go into the world, near and far, to love and serve the Lord so that Jesus might shine forth!
